This list represents only those items for which we feel there will be sufficient quantities to reliably advertise them as being there. Still, for best selection, we recommend that you get there when the sale starts. The sale area will be divided into areas like Trees/Shrubs, Sun Perennials, Shade Perennials. We will have over 300 native azaleas and they will have their own section until they sell out (usually by noon).

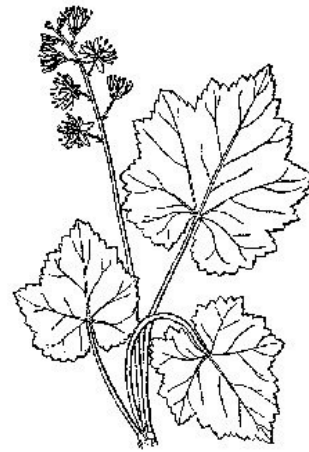

Ferns, pussytoes (part-sun) and partridgeberry (part-sun)

**Tip:** Most shade plants can handle up to 4 hours of morning sun (before noon). For hot afternoon sun, choose sun-loving plants.
