CPC Annual Meeting Update

Thanks to all of you who responded to our survey to help us plan our online annual meeting on November 7. We were delighted to get feedback from 32 people – 41% response rate! Here are the results.

In summary:

- Nearly everyone has experience and technology needed for participating in a virtual meeting, but a few may not be able to see visuals.
- Nearly everyone is comfortable joining a virtual meeting, but some will need support in voting and interacting.
- All but one respondent plans to attend the virtual meeting, so we should go ahead with our plans.
- Most interest was in sessions to share information about community projects, how-to projects, and local field trip site.
- Based on responses, we will limit the time for the meeting to 2 hours—half an hour each for business, community projects, how-to, and field trip site.

After looking at the responses, we have decided to limit our fall meeting to **two hours, from 9 - 11:00 a.m., on Saturday, November 7th.**

- **Business meeting**, led by CPC President Heather Brasell (30 minutes). You will be sent an agenda, minutes, treasurers' report, and committee reports via email prior to the meeting.

- **RFP: Community projects session** (30 minutes). We want to showcase up to 6 community projects, allowing 5 minutes per speaker. To do this online, we are asking you to create 4-5 PowerPoint slides, with several good photos. Brief information would be on the slides (who, what, when, where, why, and lessons learned). Speakers should estimate allowing about a minute per slide to discuss the basics of the project.
- **RFP: “How to do it” session** (30 minutes). We would like short presentations on such topics as native plant conservation, propagation, plant rescues, incorporating natives into the home landscape, etc. Depending on the number of volunteers, we plan to allow approximately 5-6 minutes per topic. Again, we will request 4-5 PowerPoint slides per presentation, with good photos, and basic info.
- **Virtual field trip to Cay Creek Wetland Interpretive Center**, presented by Eamonn Leonard (30 minutes). Eamonn will include management tips.

RFPs (Request for Proposals): Please think about sharing your community project, and/or a brief "how to do it" presentation for our fall conference. Contact Mary Alice Applegate (maapple@mac.com) by **September 10th** if you would like to make a presentation. Slides will be submitted by the end of October and collated into a single PowerPoint presentation. Once we have a final slate of speakers, we will develop a clear schedule to make sure we stay on track for times.
