Join Chapter friends for a full day field trip on Feb. 12, 2022 to South Georgia for guided tours of Lost Creek Forest and Wolf Creek Trout Lily Preserve.



Participants are responsible for their own transportation to and from South Georgia. Bring a camp chair and a sack lunch for a picnic between tours. Tours are free, but donations are welcome. As trails are uneven and may be muddy, participants must have full mobility. Dogs are not allowed in these areas.

Lost Creek Forest is an ancient hardwood slope forest at the Thomasville airport. Never significantly disturbed, it has continued growing in its natural state for many thousands of years.

Wolf Creek Trout Lily Preserve has the largest population known anywhere of dimpled trout lily. The timing of this trip was chosen to allow viewing during peak bloom.
