Stone Mountain Propagation Project

Stone Mountain Propagation Project (SMPP) was established in 2007 by GNPS volunteers. The site is uniquely set inside of Stone Mountain Park where volunteers work on a variety of tasks to grow Piedmont species with a backdrop of beautiful oak-hickory forest. The site is adjacent to the Park's walking trails where specialty granite outcrop plant communities can be observed.

Boy Scout Road Nursery

Boy Scout Road Nursery in Byron, Georgia was established in 2023 by the owner of Juniper Creek Natives in an effort to grow a community-supported propagation program with the Fringed Campion Chapter of GNPS. Set on native grassland along Georgia's Fall Line, volunteers help produce both Piedmont and upper Coastal Plain species. The Nursery is now operated by GNPS in conjunction with the Stone Mountain Propagation Project.
